
St. John's United Church Annual Report 2022

Music Director's Report 2022

Mulling around for a single phrase to sum up the St. John's Music Ministry in 2022, I keep coming back to something perhaps not terribly churchy: <u>On the road back to normal</u>. Once I grew comfortable with how fitting that "recovery" idea seemed for 2022, I next thought how blessed we should all feel to be this far along. Certainly back in Jan 2022 and the rapid emergence of Omicron, I personally could not see us having the rather wide-open Christmas just past! In the spirit of "how did we get back here", I have listed below, a few key moments that have stuck with me:

- <u>Mar 24:</u> The choir returned to live rehearsals! Albeit still with masks and highly social distanced inside the church sanctuary. While the province lifted most masks requirements on Mar 21, 2022, our choir continued using masks when rehearsing and performing up to the end of Jun 2022.
- <u>Also on Mar 24:</u> We cautiously welcomed our (equally cautious) fellow choristers from the Elmvale Presbyterian church to rehearse together with us for the first time in more than 2 years. I still easily recall there being great happiness expressed by many (along with much lingering fear) that evening.
- <u>Apr 15:</u> Good Friday Combined Service. Although having a rather low live attendance, our combined choir efforts for Good Friday contributed to a highly appreciated service. As always, the service was live streamed. As such, I later received lengthy feedback from a notable US virtual attendee, choir composer Don Besig. Near the start of his email Don wrote, "You and your friends created a reverent, inspiring and very "personal" mood as the music and spoken Word related the events of that day".

<u>May 8 (and Jun 19)</u>: On Mothers Day, and again on Fathers Day, the choir learned and recorded one more online anthem called "A Family of Love". Actually, on Mothers Day the choir sang the anthem live while young people in the church appeared on the new monitors, having previously recorded the "children choir" portion of the anthem. By Fathers Day Jun 19, the adult choristers had recorded their parts also, providing a complete recording of the anthem for the Jun 19th service and our YouTube channel.

Regarding the dozens of other recordings that were recording and posted to YouTube by Fern during 2020-2021, in 2022 I continued to frequently hear from churches in all parts of Canada, formally asking to use a recording or two for their own worship services. I was happy to give the ok when asked... though I suspect many others did not see a need to reach out or ask, considering the continued growth of viewing on the St. John's channel. Many of our recordings have been viewed thousands of times at the time I write this. And many of the recordings have collected a good number of LIKES and positive comments.

- <u>Jun 12:</u> "Voices for Ukraine" fundraising concert. Our concert for Ukraine was a (if not "the") musical highlight of the year. I could write pages on the wonderful pieces done that day. Better to check out yourself if interested at the link <u>HERE</u>. (the video is currently up to 220 views as I write this now). Also nice to recall the CTV news item about the concert, linked <u>HERE</u>.
- <u>Sep 18 and 25:</u> Two very sad Sundays for us. First on Sep 18, we held a very moving memorial service for those we had lost since 2020. The service included new pieces by both the choir and Double Treble. The next Sunday Sep 25 was Rev. Meg's last service with us. In honor of her last Sunday, the choir redid "I Choose Love" an anthem Rev. Meg had asked the choir to first learn in the summer of 2021 and which later in fall of 2021, became the first choir anthem sung live in a service since the start of the pandemic.
- <u>Dec 18:</u> What a musical day that was! A wonderful Lessons and Carols Service at St. John's in the morning, followed in the evening by the first combined-choirs Cantata since 2019 (Christmas Presence) at the Elmvale Presbyterian Church.

As I reviewed my calendar to find the particular events listed above, there were a whole lot of other memorable moments that came to mind. That said, I don't know that I have ever started a new year at St. John's more excited about the new music I have selected for us to sing (at least in the first half of the year). It is so nice to once again be singing and rehearsing live, though we also enjoy our ability to occasionally rehearse via zoom. Much skill... many resources! We seem well prepared to continue leading music worship in 2023 at St. John's.

We recognize how closely we work with Outreach and the Tech Team to continue to deliver high-quality services, in person and virtually, and also make St. John's presence felt out in the community in so many wonderful ways! Of course, the best news was that Coffee Time started once again! Everyone was so happy to be able to visit after church. We miss our long time worship member, Don Kennedy, and think of him each time we see something in our church that is touched by his artistic flair.

The team met virtually through 2022 and will continue to provide that option. The Worshipping Word continued to be provided on a monthly basis and for the time being, has shifted to a Weekly ENews format in order to share information with the congregation.

Rev. Meg purchased 15 copies of the book Seeking Aliveness and some members have been reading this book independently at home. Rev. Meg often referred to sections during her sermons and with Spirit Cafe. It was hoped at the time that the Confirmation Class would also be able to refer to this book in its sessions.

The Presbyterian Church choir and congregation were invited to join us for Good Friday and Sunrise services and it was wonderful to be a part of that tradition once again. Greg, Beth, and Aimee acted in a meaningful play for Easter Sunday.

Rev. Meg took Study Leave from May 15th - May 29th. Cheryl and Rev. Meg worked together to prepare services for those 3 Sundays and after her leave, Rev. Meg informed us that she had accepted a 3-point charge in the Lake of Bays United Churches, in her home area.

Cheryl and Rick emceed the Voices United for Ukraine Concert.

We had our first post-Covid Sunday School picnic and potluck lunch at Heritage Park in June. It was a fantastic time for us all. We had Sunday School start-up for 3 Sundays prior to the picnic so that relationships could be renewed and that was well received.

We fulfilled a desire to have a Solstice event on June 21st, 2022. This informal service was held at the Parnell cottage on Allenwood Beach. It was a hot night, but there was a lovely breeze off the water and 26 people participated. It was a memorable evening that should be repeated!

The church was closed for summer services in July. Jan Drinkill prepared a fellowship coffee time each Sunday for those who were interested. It was very well attended. Formal services resumed in August in the Gathering Place where the air conditioning was appreciated.

September was an extremely busy month! Welcome Back Sunday was held on Sunday, September 11th followed by a Hot Dog Lunch, thanks to Jan. A Service of Remembrance was held on Sunday, September 18th with a luncheon afterward. There was special music and a photo table. A thought worth considering is to have this open house in the evening hours when the lights and candles would be flickering even more.

Two Christmas Eve Services were held at 4:00 pm and 7:00 pm. These services were in-person and live-streamed. Attendance was good despite the stormy weather. Rev. Gredanius did a service at 4:00 pm geared toward youth and 7:00 pm more for adults. There were different hymns in each service. Unfortunately, some of our soloists were unable to get to the 7 pm service but thanks to technology, there was beautiful music. There was no in-person service on Christmas Day.

The Worship Team is planning for an exciting and busy 2023. We would welcome new members! We thank our church family who support and encourage us regularly. YouTube Livestream Statistics:

- 466 subscribers
- 89.4% of viewers have not subscribed to the channel.
- 47.1% identify as female while 52.9% identify as male.

- 56.8% of viewers have identified as being 65+ years, 28.8% fell under 55-64 years, 9.5% were between 45-54 years, 4% were between 35-44, and 1% identified as being 25-34 years
- In 2022 36% of views came from the United States while 13% were from Canada, and 3.1% from the United Kingdom
- Livestream viewers increased by 24% between October and December 2022
